<u>CENTRAL OREGON: WHERE WINTER ADVENTURES AWAIT</u> With its breathtaking natural setting, endless, culinary explorations, and more, Central Oregon is always a gateway to seasonal excitement

(SUNRIVER, Ore.) — Central Oregon's snow-capped Cascade Peaks and bluebird days have long provided a winter playground for those seeking adventure. Sure, Central Oregon is a magnet for adventure-seekers 365 days a year. But when the seasons begin to turn, hearty travelers from both near and far eagerly anticipate the thrills that winter in Central Oregon brings.

Whether an expert carver or new to the slopes, <u>Mt. Bachelor</u> – North America's sixth-largest ski and snowboard resort – will offer seemingly infinite terrain to explore. Recently nominated by the USA Today 10Best Readers Choice Awards for <u>Best Ski Resort</u> and <u>Best Place for Snowboarding</u>, Mt. Bachelor is set to debut the highly anticipated <u>Skyliner Express 6-pack chairlift</u> in December, increasing the lift capacity by 50 percent.

The corduroy trails of the Mt. Bachelor Nordic Center and the Deschutes National Forest beckon to cross-country skiers, hikers, snowshoers, and motorheads with miles of trails. For an altogether different perspective, snowshoers and Nordic skiers can adventure under the stars. Tap a local expert, such as Wanderlust Tours, for an exceptional guided experience that shares all the beauty of Central Oregon.

When it's time for a break from the chill of winter, Bend, Central Oregon's largest city and cultural heartbeat, is a hub for foodies and beer connoisseurs. Portland's beloved <u>Fire On The Mountain</u> will be opening its first Central Oregon location in October, joining a slew of other

notable dining additions, including <u>Bar Rio</u>, <u>Cascade Lakes' on Reed Market</u>, <u>Dear Irene</u>, <u>Hook & Plow</u>, and <u>Lady Bird</u>. Interesting culinary explorations await in every corner of Central Oregon, including Redmond and Sisters. In fact, Guy Fieri recently featured <u>Feast Food Co.</u> and <u>Grace and Hammer</u> in Redmond, as well as <u>High Camp Taphouse</u> in Sisters, on his show Diners, Drive-Ins and Dives.

Central Oregon might be a mecca for outdoor recreation, but it also offers an array of activities that showcase the arts and culture of the region, too. For instance, the award-winning High Desert Museum is a fascinating place to learn about the history, culture, and wildlife of Central Oregon. In addition to its endless permanent exhibitions, the High Desert Museum will offer exciting temporary exhibitions this fall and winter. Those include: "Wolves: The Photography of Ronan Donovan" (Oct. 21-Feb. 11) – an intimate look into the lives of wild wolves through the lens of the decorated National Geographic photographer – and famed artist Andy Warhol's Endangered Species Collection (Dec. 9-April 7).

Some of Central Oregon's most beloved events bring the community together each fall and winter, too. For more than 50 years, Sunriver Resort has hosted the <u>Sunriver Traditions</u>, a holiday celebration that includes the Grand Illumination tree-lighting ceremony, a holiday light show, Santa and Mrs. Claus meet-ups, Gingerbread Junction, and much more. Every February, <u>Oregon Winterfest</u> celebrates winter highlights with light, ice, and fire expositions, live music, amusement rides, food, libations, arts and crafts. This year will also mark the 7th annual <u>Winter PrideFest</u>, a massive and energetic toast to pride, inclusivity, and love of the outdoors.

Where to stay depends on the adventure that brings you to town. Whether you're coming for a ski trip with friends and family or looking to relax and recharge, there is a place for everyone.

<u>Tetherow Resort</u> was recently recognized as the No. 1 resort in the Pacific Northwest by the Condé Nast Traveler 2023 Readers' Choice Awards, a list that also includes <u>Sunriver Resort</u> and <u>Brasada Ranch</u>.
